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BUS PICK UP LOCATIONS

When we take a motor coach as our means of transportation to various activities, we usually use two pick-up locations; basically one northwest and one east. It depends on the direction of the trip. The location of the pick-up for each activity will be stated in the respective descriptions. At the present time we are using the following pickup locations.

Note: *On each activity, the arrival times are approximate.*

EAST: Taylor Square Shopping Center on Rt. 256

North. Park in the back of the Fifth Third Bank at 2883 Taylor Rd. You will be in front of Marshall's & JoAnn Fabrics. Directions from 1-70 East: Travel east on 1-70 to exit 1 12B. The exit sign says Reynoldsburg West. (The exit is west when you start but you will enter on R. 256). Turn right (North) to the first light (0.2 mi.). Turn left on Taylor Road. You are there.

NORTHWEST: Olentangy Plaza

5005 Olentangy River Rd Rte. 315 North to Bethel Rd exit, turn left (west) onto Bethel Rd. Go to the 2nd light and turn left into the parking area of the Olentangy Plaza. Park in front of the stores just west of MicroCenter near the access road. Do not park in front of the MicroCenter.



The Ohio Governor's Residence and Heritage Garden provides people of all ages with educational opportunities. The residence is a beautiful historic home with many stories to tell. The Jeffrey family originally built the house in 1928, and descendants of the family donated it to the state in 1955. Since then, nine governors' families have lived at the residence and contributed to its rich history. The residence is also filled with original Ohio arts and crafts.

The **Heritage Garden** also offers many learning opportunities. The garden provides a microcosm within which to view Ohio's natural habitats. Each garden represents a physiographic region of the state and includes plants that grow there natively. The residence gardens give visitors a unique glimpse into the natural history and current status of Ohio's environmental landscape.

Also showcased at the Governor's Residence are green energy and sustainable design technologies. The **Carriage House** is fitted with solar panel arrays that generate energy for the house and return energy to the power grid.

It is so hard to believe that it was 50 years ago that **Neil Armstrong** landed on the Moon . This trip has been designed to commemorate this historical event. Our first stop will be a tour of the **Airstream Factory** in Jackson Center, Ohio. How does this stop relate to this momentous occasion? Well, the Apollo 11 Astronauts spent several days in NASA's Mobile Quarantined facility when they returned from the moon which was actually a **converted airstream travel trailer!** The tour gives visitors the opportunity to see how the American legend Airstream is built. It is a 3/4 mile walk. No sandals or open-toes shoes permitted.

From there we will depart for Wapakoneta's **Moon City Music and Event Center**. Here guests will enjoy an OVER THE MOON experience all in one location.... Ohio based entertainment, meal history and shopping. Following the buffet lunch, guests will be entertained by the award-winning band **New Outlook**.

Next it's off to the **Armstrong Air and Space Museum**. Here guests will learn about the first man on the moon, his humble beginnings in Wapakoneta, the early space race and how the brave astronauts of that era had the "right stuff" to take us to the moon. This museum is filled with motion and sound. Visitors can practice landing the lunar module and space shuttle, or docking the Gemini capsule. You will find entertaining and challenging simulators. The 56-foot dome in the center of the museum houses the Astro Theater where guests enjoy the night sky or watch a 25-minute documentary about Apollo 11's lunar landing. There is no additional charge for the simulators or the film.

Time to rest your feet! Next will be a driving, guided tour of the area that Neil Armstrong called home. You will see Neil's boyhood home, the high school where he graduated in 1947 and more. This is not a tour to take a snooze. There is much to see and stories to hear. We will stop at the **St. Paul United Church of Christ** where the Armstrong Family attended. It has one of the oldest congregations in Wapakoneta dating back to 1850. Here you will end the day enjoying a treat of Moonpies and lemonade along with organ music.


TOILETRIES


