## BUS PICK UP LOCATIONS

When we take a motor coach as our means of transportation to various activities, we usually use two pick-up locations; basically one northwest and one east. It depends on the direction of the trip. The location of the pick-up for each activity will be stated in the respective descriptions. At the present time we are using the following pickup locations.

**Note:** *On each activity, the arrival times are approximate.*

**EAST: Taylor Square Shopping Center on Rt. 256 North.** Park in the back of the Fifth Third Bank at 2883 Taylor Rd. You will be in front of Marshall's & JoAnn Fabrics. Directions from I-70 East: Travel east on I-70 to exit 112B. The exit sign says Reynoldsburg West. (The exit is west when you start but you will enter on R. 256). Turn right (North) to the first light (0.2 mi.). Turn left on Taylor Road. You are there.

**NORTHWEST: Olentangy Plaza**  
**5005 Olentangy River Rd** Rte. 315 North to Bethel Rd exit, turn left (west) onto Bethel Rd. Go to the 2<sup>nd</sup> light and turn left into the parking area of the Olentangy Plaza. Park in front of the stores just west of MicroCenter near the access road. Do not park in front of the MicroCenter.

Come and meet **Tammy Jewell, 2019 Jefferson Award winner**. Tammy will share her story of how she grew up in a family of poverty and abuse where dignity was lacking.

In 2011 Tammy saw a need for hygiene and cleaning items for those in need of dignity. The food pantries and shelters were supplying many needs but Tammy realized there were no resources for dignity items. She had always helped people but how much could she do with her disability check? God told her "You open a help center and I will provide." So in 2011 **God's Hygiene Help Center** was opened at her home in Linden. **GHHC** is in Partnership with Columbus Parks and Recreation at Douglas and Barack Community Centers and hopes to have a Help Center in each of the 28 recreation centers in the future.

Tammy does not ask for a fee to share her story, however members are encouraged to bring both women and men's hygiene items (especially deodorant) to the meeting. Currently Tammy is sharing these items with students at Linden McKinley STEM, Windsor Elementary, Brentnell Alternative, Como, and Medina Middle.

GHHC is a 501c3 organization supported by voluntary donations. They are searching for an Executive Director, grant writer, and corporation support so they can obtain a storefront and move out of Tammy's home in Linden.

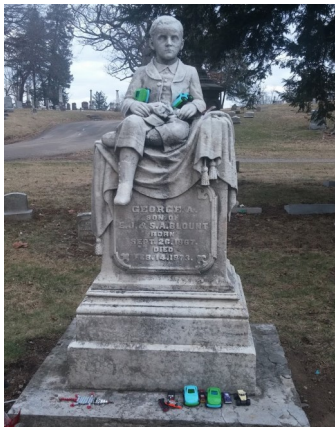

Our speaker is **Cathy Nelson**, a retired Columbus City School teacher with over thirty-six years of experience. She is the founder and president of the **Friends of Freedom**. Mrs. Nelson has testified in Congress on behalf of the **Underground Railroad Freedom Network to Freedom Act in 1997**.

She and her extensive research have won numerous awards and widespread recognition. Participating in the **Ohio Humanities Council Speakers Bureau** for nearly two decades, she has consistently been one of its most popular researchers.

During the nineteenth century, white abolitionists, slaves and free blacks cooperated to help hide and transport runaway slaves on their dangerous journey to freedom. Ohio played a prominent role in this movement.

The **Kelton House** was an important local link on the network to freedom. Today, volunteers interpret local history in order to educate our community. Cathy last spoke to us in February 2014, and has since compiled new information. A docent led tour of the home will commence after lunch. If you are not familiar with the house, you do not want to miss the tour.

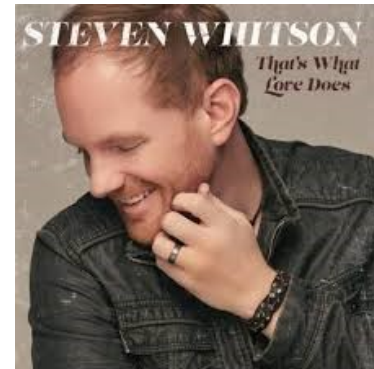

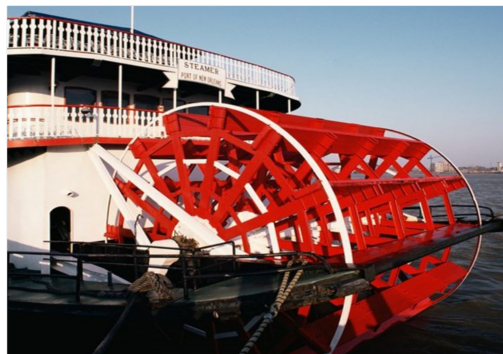
