BUS PICK UP LOCATIONS

When we take a motor coach as our means of transportation to various activities, we usually use two pick-up locations; basically one northwest and one east. It depends on the direction of the trip. The location of the pick-up for each activity will be stated in the respective descriptions. At the present time we are using the following pickup locations.

Note: *On each activity, the arrival times are approximate.*

EAST: Taylor Square Shopping Center on Rt. 256 North. Park in the back of the Fifth Third Bank at 2883 Taylor Rd. You will be in front of Marshall's & JoAnn Fabrics. Directions from 1-70 East: Travel east on 1-70 to exit 112B. The exit sign says Reynoldsburg West. (The exit is west when you start but you will enter on R. 256). Turn right (North) to the first light (0.2 mi.). Turn left on Taylor Road. You are there.

NORTHWEST: Olentangy Plaza
5005 Olentangy River Rd. Rte. 315 North to Bethel Rd exit, turn left (west) onto Bethel Rd. Go to the 2nd light and turn left into the parking area of the Olentangy Plaza. Park in front of the stores just west of MicroCenter near the access road. **Do not park in front of the MicroCenter.**

Kingwood Garden Center, a historic garden estate on the National Register of Historic Places, is renowned for its distinctive floral displays, unique plant specimens, woodland trails, historic mansion and gardens, display greenhouse, duck pond, and peacocks. Explore the gardens at your own pace, with plenty of benches to relax and soak in nature's beauty.

Kingwood Hall contains five levels, with over forty rooms including five main bedrooms, four servant quarters, ten bathrooms, an elevator, whole-house vacuum system, and twelve fireplaces – each uniquely designed. 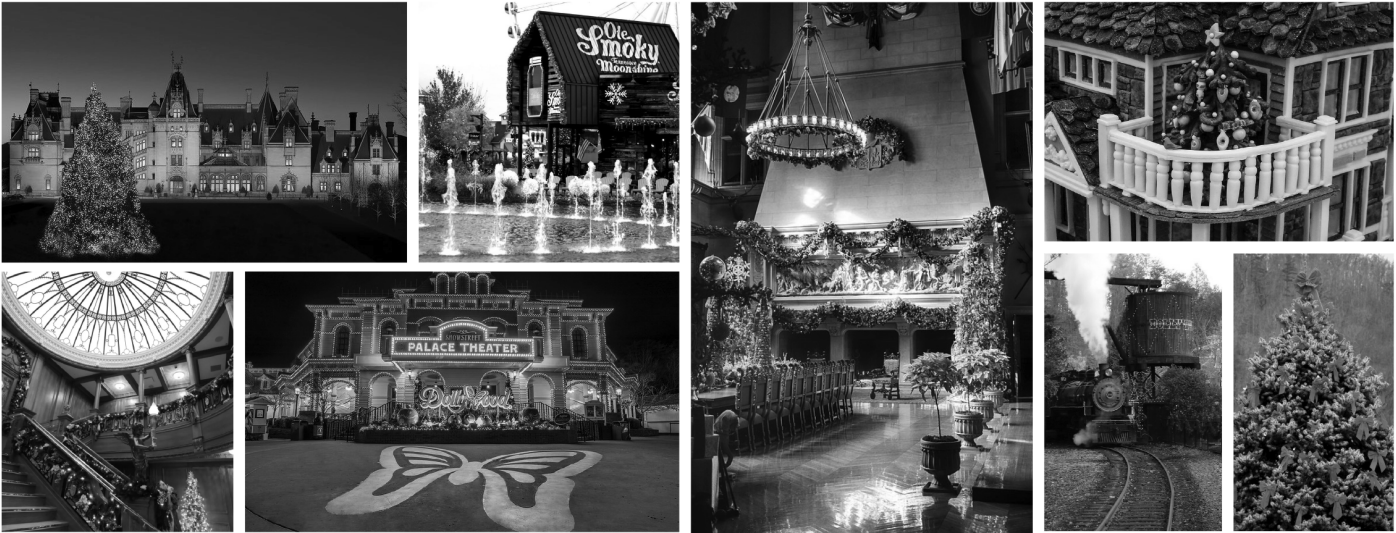
We will begin our day at the Historic Bun's Restaurant in Downtown Delaware, easily found by traveling Rt. 23 North to Sandusky St., then left on West Winter Street, or Interstate 71 North to the Rt. 36, 37 exit and following either route west into downtown to West Winter Street. A Bun's Restaurant neon sign hangs in an arch over West Winter St. in Delaware, OH. The restaurant's roots trace back to 1864, when Frederick Hoffman opened a bakery, its namesake coming from his most popular product: Buns.

After lunch, we will travel south to propagate plant plus home, a plant at home store specializing in potted, plant creations, propagation, garden, and home decor, located at 3130 Bean Oller Rd., Delaware. We will turn into a long drive on the right and straight back to a large white home and barns. Park underneath, or near the basketball hoop, and walk along the gravel path to the Potting Shed, the white building farthest to the right of the property. A golf cart, and driver will be available to take us to the potting shed, if needed. Christy is the owner of the small business and will provide us with expert insights and advice regarding house plants and everything in her shop. We will then pot our own plants to take home! A visit and/or feeding with the animals in the barn nearby can also be part of this experience.
