Bus Pick-Up Locations

When we take a motor coach as our means of transportation to various activities, we usually use two pick-up locations, basically one northwest and one east. It depends on the direction of the trip. The location of the pick-up for each activity will be stated in the respective descriptions. At the present time, we are using the following pick-up locations.

Note: On each activity, the arrival times are approximate.

EAST:

Taylor Square Shopping Center on Rt. 256 North. Park in the back of the Fifth Third Bank at 2883 Taylor Road. You will be in front of Marshall's and JoAnn Fabrics. Directions from I-70 East: Travel east on I-70 to exit 112B. The exit sign says Reynoldsburg West. (The exit is west when you start but you will enter on Rt. 256). Turn right (North) at the first right (0.2 miles) Turn left on Taylor Road. You are there.

NORTHWEST:

Olentangy Plaza, 5005 Olentangy River Road. Rt. 315 North to Bethel Road exit, turn left (west) onto Bethel Road. Go to the 2nd light and turn left into the parking area of Olentangy Plaza. Park in front of the access

Our next stop will be in the warm and inviting atmosphere of the Barn Restaurant at Sauder Village. For more than 45 years families have gathered to enjoy home-style food and welcoming hospitality under the hand-hewn timbers of a barn built in 1861. Spangler Candy Company was started in 1906 and has been a family owned and operated confectionery manufacturer in Bryan, Ohio. They also produce Bit-O-Honey, Necco Wafers, and everyone's favorite circus peanuts. There will be opportunity to purchase candies and candy canes to take home.

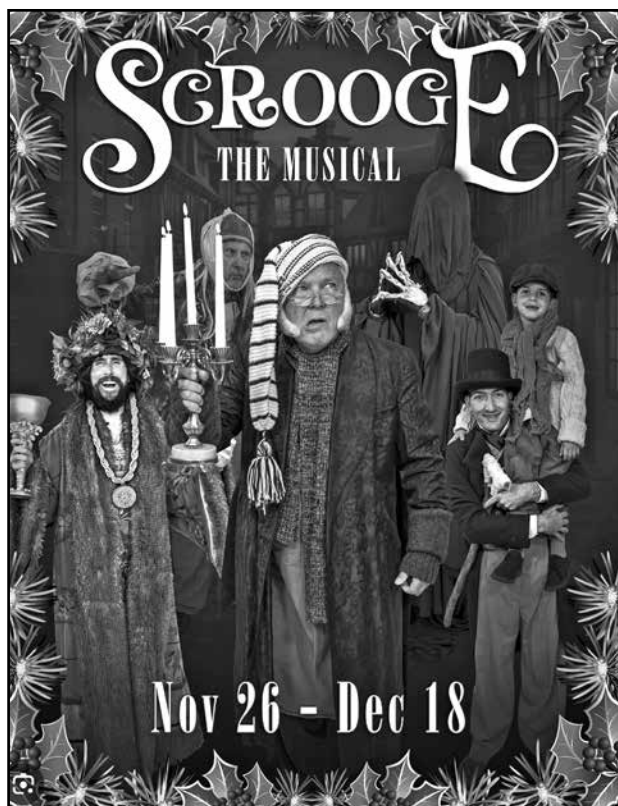

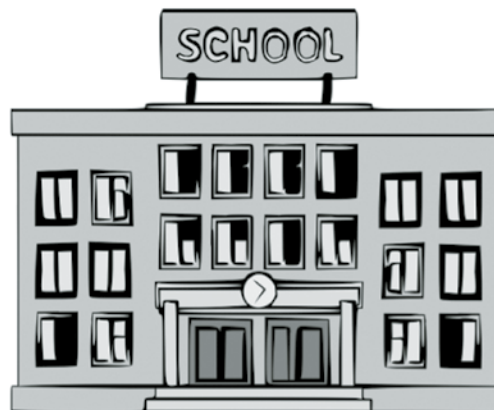
